Halloween is here!

...it seems hard to believe! Wasco School will host a costume parade and room parties next **Friday, October 30th**. As parents are preparing to purchase, borrow or make costumes, please consider the following guidelines:

- Costumes are optional!!!
- Costumes must not be of a violent or graphic nature, (no blood and guts);
- No real or pretend weapons;
- No bare midriiffs or revealing clothing
- Costumes must be appropriate for the school environment (no crude or vulgar inferences)
- Costumes must be appropriate for the changing weather
- Masks should not obstruct the child's vision
- Costumes must be easy to put on without adult assistance. With the exception of Kdg., gr. 1-5 students are asked not to wear costumes to school but will have time prior to the parade to change.
- Parents who are participating in classroom parties: if you are going to dress up, please do not wear a mask or disguise that would make it difficult for our students and staff to recognize you as a safe person. We can never be too cautious when it comes to the safety of our students!
- The Halloween parade begins at 1:15-we will exit the main entrance and "haunt" around the blacktop. Parents can find a place around the perimeter of the blacktop for viewing and pictures.
- Parties begin after parade concludes-parties end by 2:45 Classroom space and "party" space is limited! Please limit the number of visitors/young children (especially in strollers) to the classroom during party time to allow our students enough space to fully enjoy the activities.
- Parties must comply with school and classroom safety guidelines. Room parents and helpers have planned the food, games and activities to ensure all students are safe. Please do not bring food, candy or snacks to your child's classroom unless specifically assigned to do so. All foods and activities must be pre-approved.
- Cameras are welcome but PLEASE do not post pictures of children (other than your own) or staff on social media websites.
